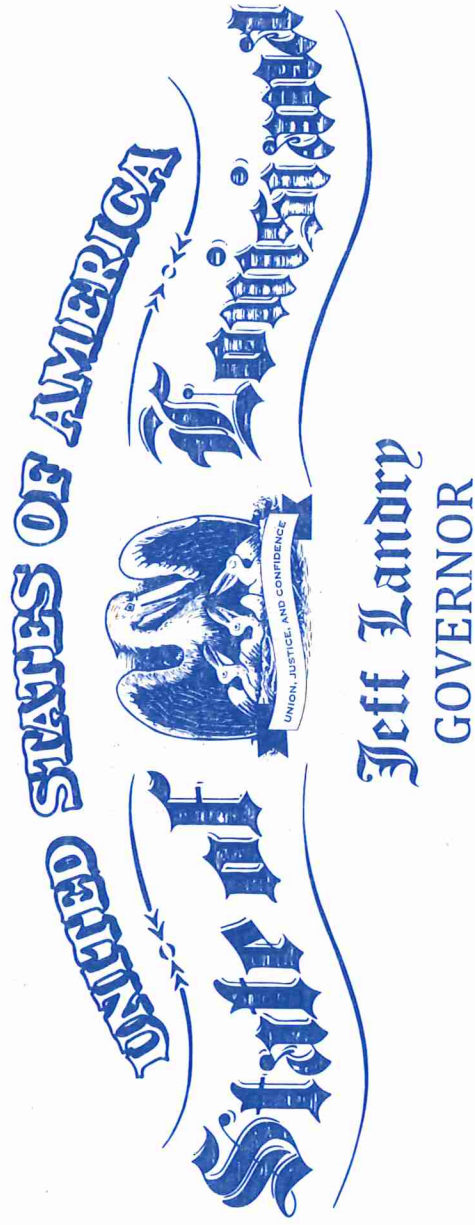




Proclamation
