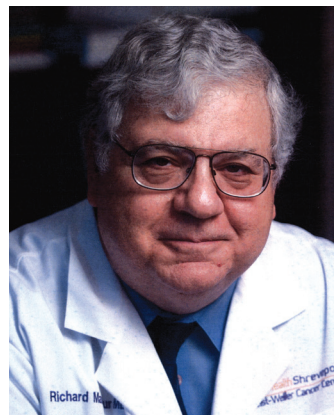
Dr. Santosh L. Saraf, MD

Dr. Richard Mansour, MD

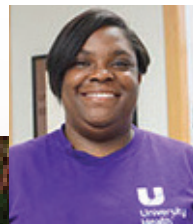

PROGRAM PURPOSE

There are approximately 3000 children and adults living with SCD in the state of Louisiana. In prior years, life expectancy for patients living with SCD was not much past the twenties. However, with improved identification and treatment, life expectancy has greatly improved and patients can live well into their 60s with the proper resources.

This activity has been designed to improve patient care by increasing learner knowledge and competency in managing aspects of sickle cell disease including potentially life threatening and debilitating complications as well as improving performance in using appropriate NIH guideline-based treatment options.
